Would you like some coffee?	Dáš si kávu? (said to a familiar person) Dáte si kávu? (formal, with respect)
Yes pleas. No, thank you.	Ano, ráda. (a woman) Ano, rád. (a man). Ne, děkuji.
Join us.	Přidej se (to 1 person), přidejte se (to more person)
Play. Play with me.	hrát si. Hraj si se mnou.
Nice to meet you again.	Rád tě zase vidím. (said by a man to 1 person) Ráda tě zase vidím. (said by a woman to 1 person). Rádi vás zase vidíme. (said by, more man and woman to more person).
sing, draw, dance, exercise, talk, be together	zpívat, malovat, tančit, cvičit, povídat si, být spolu
one, two, three, for, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten	jeden, dva, tři, čtyři, pět, šest, sedm, osm, devět, deset
